

<u>Fulton County Sportsmen's League</u> <u>2015 Spring Newsletter</u>

There are many changes to the opening of trout season this year. There will be regional and statewide Mentored Youth Trout Days. Please carefully read your manual concerning regulations for the mentored youth trout days. The opening day of trout season will be on **April 4th** for Franklin County and **April 18th** for Fulton County. Make sure you check your Pa. Fishing Summary for the opening date of your favorite trout stream. The state trout to be stocked this year are going to be the same as previous years. There are a few changes to regulations this year so read the summary carefully. There have been changes to the penalties for fishing violations.

Good water flow and quality at the trout nursery, except for the summer, has produced outstanding quality rainbow trout. The state gave us 10,000 brown trout instead of 10,000 rainbow trout. Brown trout have been difficult to raise at our nursery. Poor water flow and water quality over the summer has made the brown trout susceptible to a bacterial infection commonly known as fin rot. The Fish Commission treated the fish in December. A large number of these brown trout were lost. Over 150 hold over trout were also lost over the course of the year. The brown trout will be small this year because of the disease issues and difficulty of raising brown trout at our nursery. This year we should have some very nice one-year-old rainbow trout to stock that average around 12 inches. In spite of our losses approximately 14000 one-year-old trout will be stocked in Fulton County streams by the Sportsmenøs League. There are also approximately 500 two-year old trout to be stocked this year. Dave Lippert, Larry Zimmerman, Harold Lynch, our nursery manager and Norm Mellott, our nursery caretaker have done outstanding jobs of taking care of the trout nursery in order to provide quality trout for the streams of Fulton County.

The Fulton County Sportsmenøs League will not be responsible to loss or damage to deer stands left on the farm property. If you have left a deer stand on club property it should be removed after the close of the hunting season.

The Club purchased 6 tons of corn for the winter feeding program at the farm. If the CWD management area is expanded we may not be allowed to feed wildlife at the farm next winter.

The need for action to keep more game such as deer on the farm was discussed at various meetings. The hunting practice of using a gang to drive for deer was also discussed. Many members in attendance at these monthly meetings thought that driving for deer forced a lot of game from the farm property. A motion to prohibit driving for deer was discussed and approved. Starting on January 1, 2014 the practice of driving for deer will be prohibited on the Sportsmenøs Farm. Hunting with a gang as discussed in the Pa. Game Commission Regulations will be prohibited. Members that hunt the farm are requested to monitor gang hunting and report if the change improves the quality and quantity of deer on the farm.

Dues 2015

Annual **adult dues** for the Fulton County Sportsmenøs League will be **\$20.00 per year**. Youth annual membership dues will remain at \$5.00. The \$5.00 initiation fee for new memberships will be discontinued. Dues may be paid for one year only. No multiyear memberships are available.

Fishing rodeo and open house Concerns.

Please obey all club and Pennsylvania Fish Commission regulations for the special area designated for children age 12 and younger only. Fishing regulations are posted when you register your children. Club members will be monitoring this special regulation area along with Fish Commission officers. Persons violating the rules will be subject to receiving fishing violation fines from the Fish Commission. This section of stream is for children only, not adults. As an adult you are permitted to cast the line for a young child, but the child must be holding the fishing pole, in possession of the fishing pole, set the hook themselves, and land the fish themselves. You may assist taking the fish off of the hook. Please be careful to observe these rules or you could be subjected to a fine.

Registration of children for the rodeo will start at 10:00am, fishing will start at 12:00pm, and the raffle drawing will be at 3:00pm.

I want to thank everyone who helped keep the nursery functioning properly. We can always use help at the nursery. If you can help call Harold.

When we have clean up day for the rodeo please bring your weed eaters to trim grass.

Help is needed for all club events, please volunteer. We also need help at the nursery during the summertime. When the water level gets low we need volunteers to clean the screens on the fish bins daily. Screens must be cleaned daily in order for water to properly flow though the raceways. Anyone who wants to help clean the screens and work on trout nursery projects please call Harold Lynch so he can get your name and phone number. Harold will compile a list of volunteers. It takes a lot of help, more than most people realize. In order to insure that we have trout for the following year your help and support is needed.

Projects

Repair work on the water inlets to the raceways is completed. Additional stream bank restoration work was completed between the fish bins. Restoration work on the lower section of Esther Run is being planned. The replacement of the iron fish bin grates with a lighter weight material was canceled because of the high cost. Instead we cut the bins covers into small 12-foot sections. We will be applying for a grant from the Pa. Fish Commission to help cover some of the cost.

On March 17, 1978, Don McQuade spoke to the Fulton County Sportsmenøs about naming a Sportsman of the Year. According to the minutes, 1978 was the first year for the award. Following is a list of individuals that have been named as a Sportsman of the Year.
